


A public body, our annual budget is around £98 million




Around 5% of that is invested in Impact, Evidence and Knowledge Exchange

Another 19% is directed towards specific research calls, based on particular areas and themes



There is no demonstrable risk management


There is no thought to Pathways to Impact

The proposal contains unnecessary or distracting elements just to fit an unsuitable scheme


The proposal doesn't use language employed by the Funding Guide



The research is completely outside the AHRC's remit


The research 'chases' an agenda, and does not focus on academic value first and foremost
